Healing at the Sanctuary

Heartworm disease is an infectious disease transmitted from mosquitos to dogs that results in lung, heart, and other internal organ damage. Heartworm disease is easily and inexpensively prevented with monthly oral or topical medications. Although easily prevented, heartworm disease is harder to treat once a dog acquires it via a mosquito bite. Treatment can be costly and lead to severe medical complications (such as clots to the lungs). Therefore, it is critical that activity and exercise restriction is strictly enforced during heartworm treatment.

The American Heartworm Society has established recommended guidelines for the diagnosis and treatment of heartworm disease. At Mackenzie's Animal Sanctuary, we follow these established guidelines to ensure our heartworm positive dogs have the best possible outcome



with minimal complications. Prior to treatment, heartworm disease is confirmed with multiple blood tests and the severity of the infection is determined with chest x-rays, urinalysis, and additional blood work.



Once a diagnosis is confirmed, our heartworm positive dogs are started on activity restrictions, anti-inflammatories, heartworm preventives, and medications to help kill microfilariae (aka: "baby heartworms"). After we have given the dogs' bodies time to recover from killing the

microfilariae in their bloodstream, we then administer a series of injections that kill the adult heartworms. Activity restriction is continued for two additional months after these injections.

From start to finish, heartworm disease takes three months to treat. After treatment is completed, dogs will continue to test positive for heartworm for at least six months. Therefore, veterinarians are unable to definitely confirm heartworm treatment have been successful



until nine months from the time of diagnosis and treatment was started!

December 15, 2015 proved to be one of the BEST birthdays I had ever celebrated, for we were receiving our beautiful GSD, Sadee, the very next day. While we had every intention of rescuing a pup to fill our home with furbaby love once again...we lost our 17-year old beagle, Belle, back in February... little did we know it would be Sadee that actually rescued us... from the very beginning!

Sadee came to us as a spunky 13-month old with all the personality of a typical GSD...a new breed to us. She quickly nestled into our hearts and home, but it wasn't until March did we begin to realize the gift that she truly was...and continues to be. You see, with just three months into our relationship came the devastating news that her daddy...and my love of nearly 40 years...had liver cancer. My world crumbled that day, but it was the pure love and devotion of Our Sadee Girl that got us through the dark days of testing, imaging, a microwave ablation, countless transplant qualification meetings, and ultimately the transplant that would save his life. Despite a secondary diagnosis of biliary duct cancer, today marks four and a half weeks since Dale's liver transplant. Sadee has not left his side since he's come home, and I'm convinced his remarkable recovery is, at least in part, due to her love and loyalty. Our family continues to be hit with tragedy this year...not gonna lie...will be relieved to see the end of 2016...but it is Sadee that continues to help us see the joys of the simple things of life and to relish in our blessings as opposed to dwelling on our adversities. We have no doubt, she was destined to be ours...our angel here

She seems to have no idea of personal space...a common trait of the GSD, we've come to understand...she is a staple in the bathroom when we don't close the door behind us and sits at our feet under the table when we eat..., gives the best hugs and kisses, greets everyone with an exuberant jump and wag of her powerful tail, loves her chew and squeaky toys, long walks, FOOD, and her 15-month old human
