

Healing at the Sanctuary

BEING THEIR 'HOME ALONG THE WAY' FOR AS LONG AS THEY NEED.



Quincy was diagnosed with Osteosarcoma of his left rear limb in April. Osteosarcoma is a bone cancer most commonly diagnosed in large breed senior dogs. Often the first sign of this disease is owners noticing their dogs limping and/or favoring one of their limbs. To diagnose bone cancer, x-rays and other specialized tests (biopsies) are performed.

Unfortunately, bone cancer is very aggressive and has usually started to microscopically spread throughout the body by the time of diagnosis. Additionally, it is a very painful disease as the cancer cells replicate and destroy previously normal bone. Therefore, the main treatment goals of bone cancer are to minimize discomfort while slowing down the spread of disease ("metastasis").

To help Quincy battle osteosarcoma, his cancerous leg was amputated as it was causing him intense discomfort. He began to happily run around on three legs within a couple days of surgery. Most dogs transition to life with three legs very well! Now that he has fully healed from surgery, his chemotherapy has started. Chemotherapy is the second step to osteosarcoma treatment as it attacks the cancer's metastasis.

You'll be happy to know that chemotherapy in dogs is rarely associated with the same intense side effects as chemotherapy in humans. Our goal is to slow down his cancer with chemotherapy while maintaining his energy, appetite, and joy for life. Therefore, Quincy has been in great spirits throughout his treatment!
